**IPEDS** is an abbreviation for Integrated Postsecondary Education Data Systems; their website is <http://nces.ed.gov/ipeds/>. <http://nces.ed.gov/ipeds/>

Every university in the U.S. that receives money from the federal government submits data to the U.S. Department of Education, which is made public.

IPEDS data does not include medical school basic science faculty; Pitt's AAUP data does. Thus, Pitt's AAUP faculty salaries can be \$1000s higher than IPEDS salaries.

**For faculty salaries among the public AAU universities for 2011-12, the IPEDS Data Base shows that Pitt ranks:**

**15 out of 35** for full professor (**P**) salaries; it was 21 of 35 in 2009-10.

**19 out of 35** for associate professor (**AO**) salaries; it was 22 of 35 in 2009-10.

**30 out of 35** for assistant professor (**AI**) salaries; it was 31 of 35 in 2009-10.

**18 out of 28** for instructor (**IN**) salaries; it was 19 of 27 in 2009-10 (7 public AAU peers in 2011-12 (8 in 2009-10) do not have any instructors by IPEDS criteria).

**30 out of 31** for lecturer (**Lect**) salaries; it was 29 of 31 in 2009-10 (4 public AAU peers do not have any lecturers by IPEDS criteria).

**14 out of 20** for no rank (**NR**) salaries; it was 16 of 19 in 2009-10 (15 public AAU peers in 2011-12 (16 in 2009-10) do not have any no rank faculty by IPEDS criteria).

**33 out of 35** for all ranks (**AR**) salaries; it was 32 of 35 in Fall, 2009.

The All Ranks (**AR**) faculty salary category reflects the disparity between the number of higher paid faculty versus the number of lower paid faculty at a university.

The lower the **AR salary**, the greater the disparity. **Pitt has one of the lowest AR (All Ranks) average salary (#33 out of 35 for 2011-12) of the public AAU universities.**

The ratio **AR/P** (the All Ranks average salary divided by the full professor salary) reflects the disparity between the salaries of full professors and lower paid faculty.

The lower the **AR/P** ratio, the greater the disparity. **Pitt has the second lowest AR/P ratios (#34 out of 35 for 2011-12) of the public AAU universities.**

The **%P** (% full professors) is the percentage of the faculty who have been promoted to full professor by an institution.

The lower the **%P**, the lower the total cost of faculty salaries at a university. **Pitt has the second lowest %P (#34 of 35 for 2011-12) of the public AAU universities.**
